PEOPLE FIRST! AND E-LIFE

People first! is the last installment in a series of four public forums that have been staged by the Science et Cité foundation under the heading «e-life». The event is currently being exhibited in the main hall of the Cornavin



railway station in Geneva. People first! is an artistic installation by BITNIK.ORG. It juxtaposes video-taped sequences of the previous forums within the «e-life» series with graphic works that represent aspects of society in

the age of global information. The idea is to place the debate in Switzerland about the information age within the wider context of global developments.

The «e-life» series with its four public forums have been staged in Lausanne, Zurich, Lugano and Berne during October and November 2003. They offered an opportunity to citizens of this country to learn more about the way new information technologies are being used in the fields of education, business, health, at work places and in public administration. The forums have explored research that has been going on in these areas and assessed progress made so far. They have also offered opportunities to participants at the forums to air their views and voice their concerns.
